A RESOLUTION TO RESTRICT TELECOMMUTING BY SOUTH CAROLINA STATE EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, temporary worksite modifications due to the Covid pandemic of 2019-2021 led to an increase in telecommuting arrangements by which employees perform their job duties from a location other than the designated work site, typically their homes; and

WHEREAS, the Covid pandemic is no longer present and there are concerns that telecommuting has impacted productivity, collaboration, innovation, team cohesion, training, efficiency, facilities cost, and the benefits of direct supervision;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SOUTH CAROLINA REPUBLICAN PARTY FOR SUBMISSION TO THE SOUTH CAROLINA LEGISLATURE THAT:

No state employee shall be permitted to telecommute on any given work day subject to specific exceptions authorized by the work location manager.

Exceptions

- Individual health reasons supported by medical documentation.
- Work roles where telecommuting has proven to enhance productivity significantly, subject to periodic review by the work location manager.
- Situations where commuting poses an undue burned or safety risk, as assessed by the work location manager.

Implementation, Compliance, and Review

- This restriction will take effect at such time as specified by the adoption legislation allowing for adequate preparation.
- Regular compliance checks will be conducted by office of the South Carolina state auditor.
- This resolution shall be reviewed biennially by the work location manager to assess its impact on productivity with adjustments made as necessary.
